INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Early Years District Profile is to bring together a wide range of indicators for each district. It provides the commissioners with a robust evidence base across a range of health and wellbeing issues to help identify priority areas to target and place services in appropriate areas.

The report pulls together information from various sources to present a picture of the health and wellbeing of children aged 0-4, following through the Best Start Pathway.

The data is presented and displayed at Ward Level with comparisons made with Staffordshire and England. Information used in the report is the latest available at the time of writing.

Health and social needs are complex and it is unlikely that there will be a single factor which is responsible for the particular situation in each local area. Therefore, it is important that no single item of information is treated in isolation. Instead the various pieces of data and evidence should be used together to give a better picture of the needs of children and young people in the local community.


We aim to produce this annually with the next one being due November 2016 to support the Districts with their Local Authority annual conversations.

- Overall East Staffordshire has a higher than county average proportion of under 5's but a similar proportion to that of the national picture. At ward level there is some variance, with Anglesey, Eton Park and Shobnall having the highest proportions of under 5's.
 - There is a lower proportion of children in East Staffordshire in the most deprived national quintile for the Child Wellbeing Index, in comparison to nationally, but this proportion is more than twice that of the Staffordshire percentage.
 - There are five wards; Anglesey, Eton Park, Shobnall, Stapenhill and Winshill with a large proportion of children in the most deprived quintile., whereas 16 out of the 21 wards have no children in the lowest quintile nationally.

- There is a lower rate of Looked After Children in East Staffordshire compared to both Staffordshire and England. The rate of children subject of a CP plan is lower in comparison to the England figure with a number of wards having suppressed figures due to the low numbers.
- However, the rate of Children in Need is appreciably above the county and national averages with Anglesey, Burton, Eton Park and Shobnall all having a significantly larger proportion of Children in Need.
- 13.6% of Staffordshire's BRFC families reside in East Staffordshire of which 51% of the children are under the age of 5.
- Winshill has the largest number of families eligible for BRFC, however Shobnall has the largest number of children under the age of 5 who are eligible.

- Horninglow has the largest number of households with children with Weaver ward having the least.
- Horninglow also has the largest percentage of lone parent households with children, along with Anglesey and Eton Park. Yoxall and Abbey are the two wards with the lowest percentage of lone parent households with children.
- Overall, East Staffordshire has a lower percentage of lone parent households with children in comparison to national but marginally higher than the Staffordshire average.

- The Early Years Reach across the East Staffordshire district ranges from 28.1% in Weaver to 75.6% in Stapenhill, giving an overall average for the district of 56.6%.
- The overall reach of 56.6% for East Staffordshire is considered good by Ofsted.
- Of the 21 wards in East Staffordshire, only 1 ward, Stapenhill has a reach that is considered outstanding by Ofsted. Of the remaining 20 wards, 12 have a reach considered to be good. The remaining 8 wards are below 51%, the level considered to be good.

- The teenage pregnancy rate in East Staffordshire is similar to that of England and Staffordshire. The rates are significantly higher than both Staffordshire and national in Stapenhill, Anglesey, Burton and Winshill.
- Figures in 7 of the 21 wards are supressed due to low numbers of teenage pregnancies.
- It should be noted that 54% of all the under 18 conceptions in East Staffordshire have resulted in abortions.

- General Fertility Rates are statistically higher than England in Anglesey, Shobnall and Eton Park. There are 10 wards out of 21 with the lowest rates, with the rate being significantly lower than Staffordshire and England. Yoxall ward has the lowest rate.
- Yoxall also has the lowest number of live births with an annual average of 12 births in comparison to Anglesey which has a significantly higher number of births with 169.

- The percentage of mothers who take up breastfeeding at birth in East Staffordshire is particularly low compared to the national average, with Eton Park, Shobnall, Heath and Brizlincote having significantly lower rates than national.
- 91% of mothers in Crown ward take up breastfeeding at birth which is significantly more than England, however only 42.9% are still breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks which is a significant drop.
- Breastfeeding prevalence is significantly lower across all the wards when compared to England with the exception of Yoxall where 57.1% of mothers are still breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks, which is 10 percentage points above England.

- There are 169 PVI childcare providers in East Staffordshire of which 66% provided a response to the sufficiency audit.
- There are 97 PVI childcare providers registered for funded childcare places of which 92% provided a response.
- The current childcare sufficiency shows overall in East Staffordshire there is a 22% vacancy rate for three and four year olds who are entitled to 15 hours of free childcare. For children requiring a Think2 childcare place there is also currently a 30% vacancy rate in East Staffordshire.
