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INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Early Years District Profile is to bring together a wide range of indicators for each district. It provides the commissioners with a robust evidence base across a range of health and wellbeing issues to help identify priority areas to target and place services in appropriate areas.

The report pulls together information from various sources to present a picture of the health and wellbeing of children aged 0-4, following through the Best Start Pathway.

The data is presented and displayed at Ward Level with comparisons made with Staffordshire and England. Information used in the report is the latest available at the time of writing.

Health and social needs are complex and it is unlikely that there will be a single factor which is responsible for the particular situation in each local area. Therefore, it is important that no single item of information is treated in isolation. Instead the various pieces of data and evidence should be used together to give a better picture of the needs of children and young people in the local community.

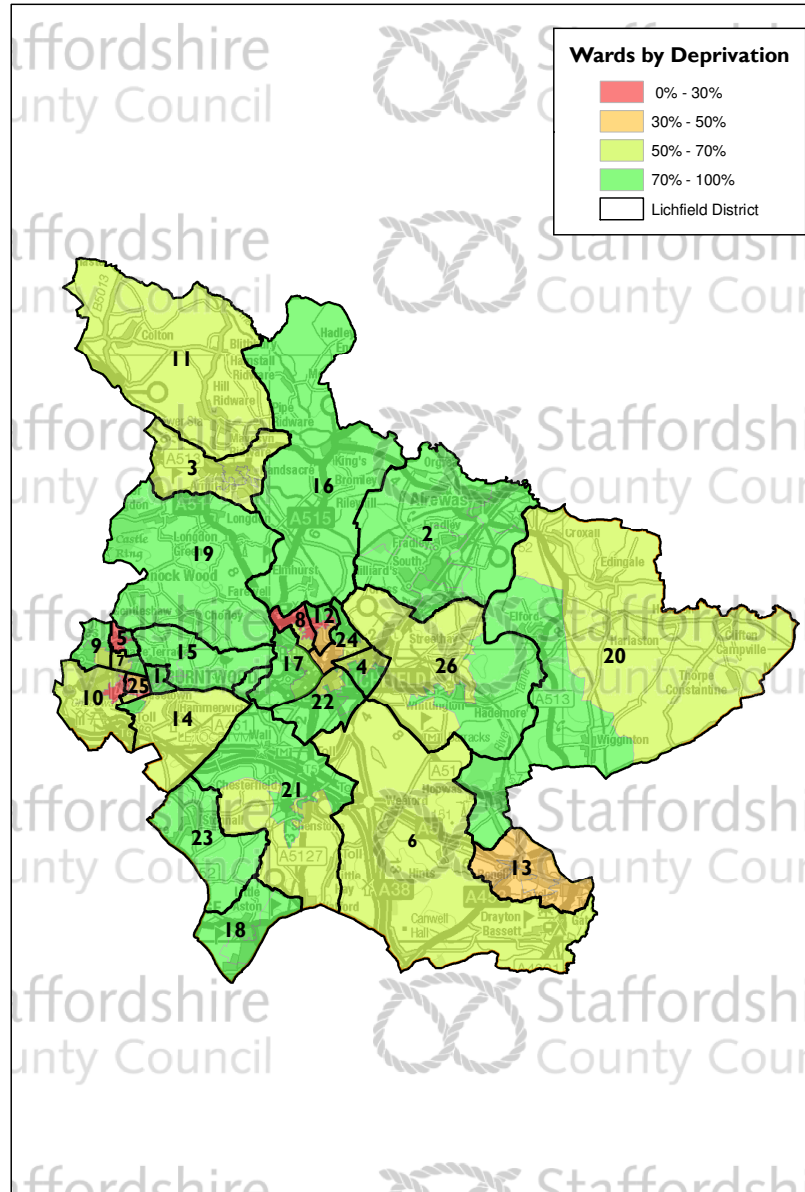
We aim to produce this annually with the next one being due November 2016 to support the Districts with their Local Authority annual conversations.

- Lichfield has a lower under 5 population in comparison to national proportions at 5.1% of the district population
- Chadsmead and Summerfield are the only wards that have significantly higher proportions than the national average.
- Bourne Vale and Little Aston both have a significantly high proportion of children in the BME population, with Little Aston being 2.8 percentage points above the England average of 20%.
- There are no children in wards within the Lichfield district who are classified as living in the most deprived national quintile for the Child Wellbeing Index.

- In Lichfield there is a lower rate of children being subject of a Child Protection Plan, Looked After or a Child in Need compared to England. This is evident in the fact that the majority of the wards have figures suppressed due to the low numbers.
- In comparison to the national and Staffordshire rate of Looked After children, there is a significantly higher rate in Curborough, which is nearly double the national average.
- 11.4% of Staffordshire's BRFC families reside in Lichfield of which 28% of the children are under the age of 5. Chadsmead and Summerfield have the most number of identified families.

- 5 of the 26 wards in Lichfield have significantly small numbers of households with children, with Leomansley having the largest number.
- Chadsmead has the largest percentage of lone parent households with children, which is greater than Staffordshire and England. Conversely Longdon has the lowest percentage of lone parent households with children at 1.7% which is significantly below Lichfield, Staffordshire and England.
- 20 of the wards in Lichfield have similar or considerably lower percentages of lone parent households compared to England.

- The Early Years Reach across the Lichfield district ranges from 16.2% in Little Aston to 78.6% in Chasetown, giving an overall average for the district of 55.8%.
- The overall reach of 55.8% for Lichfield is considered good by Ofsted.
- Of the 26 wards in Lichfield, only 6 wards have a reach that is considered outstanding by Ofsted.
- Of the remaining 20 wards, 7 have a reach considered to be good. The remaining 13 wards are below 51%, the level considered to be good.

- Lichfield overall has a slightly greater rate of under 18 conceptions than Staffordshire or England.
- Summerfield, Chadsmead and Curborough have significantly high proportions of teenage pregnancies compared to England and Staffordshire.
- Alrewas & Fradley and Leomansley have the smallest reportable proportion of teenage pregnancies, with figures for 12 of the 26 wards suppressed due to low numbers.
- However, 58% of all under 18 conceptions in Lichfield have resulted in abortions.

- General Fertility Rates are statistically higher than England in the Lichfield wards of Boney Hay, Armitage with Handsacre and St John's. The lowest rates are in King's Bromley and Burntwood Central, where the rates are significantly lower than Staffordshire and England.
- Leomansley has the highest number of live births with an annual average of 88 births; this is in comparison to King's Bromley which has a significantly lower number of births with an annual average of 8.

- 7 of the 26 wards in Lichfield have the same or a marginally higher percentage of mothers smoking at time of delivery compared to Staffordshire and England averages.
- Data for 19 of the 26 wards in Lichfield are suppressed due to the low numbers.
- Armitage with Handsacre has the lowest reportable percentage of babies who are born with a low birthweight compared to Bourne Vale, where 23.8% of babies were born under 2,500g. This percentage is significantly higher than the national average of 7.4%.

- Compared to the national average of 74%, the percentage of mothers who take up breast feeding at birth in Lichfield is similar or marginally lower in 16 out of 26 wards.
- Although there is a low take up of breastfeeding at birth of 33% in Boney Hay, the prevalence at 6-8 weeks shows only a slight decrease to 27%.
- 90% of mothers in Bourne Vale take up breastfeeding at birth which is significantly more than England, however only 45% are still breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks which is a significant drop of 50%.
- Breastfeeding prevalence is significantly lower across all the wards when compared to England, except for Colton & Mavesyn Ridware, where more mothers are breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks than at birth.
