INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Early Years District Profile is to bring together a wide range of indicators for each district. It provides the commissioners with a robust evidence base across a range of health and wellbeing issues to help identify priority areas to target and place services in appropriate areas.

The report pulls together information from various sources to present a picture of the health and wellbeing of children aged 0-4, following through the Best Start Pathway.

The data is presented and displayed at Ward Level with comparisons made with Staffordshire and England. Information used in the report is the latest available at the time of writing.

Health and social needs are complex and it is unlikely that there will be a single factor which is responsible for the particular situation in each local area. Therefore, it is important that no single item of information is treated in isolation. Instead the various pieces of data and evidence should be used together to give a better picture of the needs of children and young people in the local community.

We aim to produce this annually with the next one being due November 2016 to support the Districts with their Local Authority annual conversations.



OVERVIEW

 Overall, South Staffordshire district has a significantly lower under 5 population compared to national proportions.

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- Huntington & Hatherton ward has a significantly higher proportion than the national average with Trysull & Seisdon and Himley & Swindon having significantly lower numbers.
- Featherstone & Shareshill is the only ward within the district of South Staffordshire to have a significantly higher proportion of children in the most deprived national quintile for the Child Wellbeing Index.

OVERVIEW

Within South Staffordshire there are substantially lower numbers of children being subject of a Child Protection Plan, being Looked After or a Child in Need compared to England. This is highlighted by the fact that the majority of the wards have their data suppressed due to low numbers.

There is a significantly higher rate of children subject of a Child Protection Plan compared to the national average in the Pattingham & Patshull ward.

11.3% of Staffordshire's BRFC families reside in South Staffordshire of which 42% of the children are under the age of 5. Huntington & Hatherton has the largest number of families within the programme.

• Bilbrook has the largest percentage of lone parent households with children, which is above Staffordshire and England figures. Himley & Swindon ward has the lowest percentage of lone parent households with children at 2.3% which less than half the Staffordshire and England averages.

• The majority of the wards in South Staffordshire have a similar or considerably lower percentage of lone parent households compared to England.

OVERVIEW

The Early Years Reach across the South Staffordshire district ranges from 32.2% in Himley & Swindon ward to 83.3% in Penkridge West, giving an overall average for the district of 55.2%.

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- The overall reach of 55.2% for South Staffordshire is considered good by Ofsted.
- Of the 25 wards in South Staffordshire, 10 wards are below 51%, the rate deemed good by Ofsted, 10 wards are deemed good as they have a reach of between 51-65%, with the remaining 5 wards deemed outstanding.

- The Teenage Pregnancy rates in Trysull & Seisdon, Huntington & Hatherton and Essington are significantly higher than the rates for England and Staffordshire. The rate is exceptionally high in Trysull & Seisdon, being more than double the Staffordshire rate.
- Great Wyrley Town and Penkridge South East have the smallest proportions of teenage pregnancies at 16.6% and 17.8% respectively.
- However, 78% of all the under 18 conceptions in South Staffordshire have resulted in abortions.

Overall, general fertility rates in South Staffordshire are statistically lower than the national average, and also below the Staffordshire average.

The rate for Huntington & Hatherton is higher than England by almost 10 percentage points, but this ward also has the highest live birth rate in South Staffordshire with an annual average of 77 births.

Trysull & Seisdon has a significantly lower general fertility rate compared to the national average and also has the lowest live birth rate in the district with an annual average of only 11 births.

Overall, South Staffordshire has a low percentage of mothers smoking at time of delivery compared to Staffordshire and England, with 19 of the 25 wards significantly lower as is shown by the suppression of data.

- Perton Lakeside has the largest proportion with 28% of mothers smoking at delivery which is significantly higher than the England and Staffordshire rate of 14%.
- Babies born in South Staffordshire with a low birthweight is 5.8% which is lower than the Staffordshire and England averages of 7.3% and 7.4% respectively.
- This average percentage for the district masks the variation between wards where the range is from 2.0% in Essington to 14.6% in Himley & Swindon.

90% of mothers take up breastfeeding at birth in Perton East which is significantly higher than the national average of 74%, however, a very small proportion of mothers within this ward are still breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks, with the breastfeeding prevalence being so low that the figures are suppressed.

- 69% of mothers take up breastfeeding at birth in Essington which is similar to the national average, however only 15.7% are still breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks which is a significantly below England and the biggest decline in the district.
- Breastfeeding prevalence is significantly lower across majority of the wards when compared to England, however, Brewood & Coven, Codsall North and Penkridge South East have a higher than national proportion of mothers still breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks.
