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INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Early Years District Profile is to bring together a wide range of indicators for each district. It provides the commissioners with a robust evidence base across a range of health and wellbeing issues to help identify priority areas to target and place services in appropriate areas.

The report pulls together information from various sources to present a picture of the health and wellbeing of children aged 0-4, following through the Best Start Pathway.

The data is presented and displayed at Ward Level with comparisons made with Staffordshire and England. Information used in the report is the latest available at the time of writing.

Health and social needs are complex and it is unlikely that there will be a single factor which is responsible for the particular situation in each local area. Therefore, it is important that no single item of information is treated in isolation. Instead the various pieces of data and evidence should be used together to give a better picture of the needs of children and young people in the local community.


We aim to produce this annually with the next one being due November 2016 to support the Districts with their Local Authority annual conversations.

- Overall, Stafford has a low proportion of under 5's compared to both national and county proportions. At ward level there is some variance, with Coton and Penkside having 9.0% and 8.4% respectively, both higher than the national average.
- The majority of the wards (22 out of 26) in Stafford have no children in the most deprived national quintile for the Child Wellbeing Index, however, Tillington, Holmcroft, Highfields & Western Downs and Penkside are above the England average with Penkside the highest at 54.6%.

- Within Stafford there are a large number of wards with low numbers of children being subject of a Child Protection Plan and being Looked After as identified by the need to suppress data due to low numbers. There are 5 wards, all with a rate of children subject of a Child protection Plan above the rate nationally. Similarly there are 10 wards out of 26 with a rate of Looked After children above the Staffordshire rate and only I ward, Coton, where the rate is marginally below.
- The rate of children in Need across Stafford district varies from 12.5 in Chartley to 146.5 in Highfields, giving an overall rate for Stafford of 68.5 children per 1,000.
- 10.7% of Staffordshire's BRFC families reside in Stafford of which 52.9% of the children are under the age of 5.
- Highfields & Western Downs has the largest number of families and also has the largest number of children under the age of 5.

- Highfields & Western Downs has the largest percentage of lone parent households with children, which is higher than Staffordshire and England.
- Chartley, Seighford and Milwich are the wards with the lowest percentages of lone parent households with children.

- The Early Years Reach across the Stafford district ranges from 35.1% in Fulford ward to 81.0% in Highfields, giving an overall average for the district of 54.3%.
- The overall reach of 54.3% for Stafford is within the range considered good by Ofsted.
- Of the 26 wards in Stafford, 12 wards are below 51%, the rate deemed good by Ofsted, 11 wards are deemed good as they have a reach of between 51-65%, with the remaining 3 wards, of Highfields, Manor and Holmcroft deemed outstanding.

- The teenage pregnancy rate in Stafford is relatively similar to the national average, however, Highfields, Manor, Coton and Penkside are all significantly higher.
- Penkside has a rate that is 2.5 times more than the Staffordshire average.
- The lowest rates of teenage pregnancy can be found in Eccleshall, Stonefield & Christchurch and Holmcroft with rates of 17.4, 20.9 and 22.0 respectively.
- However, it should be noted that 82% of all the under 18 conceptions in Stafford result in abortions.

- General Fertility Rates are statistically higher in the Stafford wards of Coton and Penkside, at over 10 per 1,000 more than the national figure of 64.
- The lowest proportions of general fertility can be found in Eccleshall and Church Eaton. All but 4 wards have a rate below that of the England average.
- Church Eaton also has one of the lowest number of live births along with Milwich and Chartley, in comparison to Highfields & Western Downs which has a significantly higher number of births with an annual average of 90.

- The percentage of mothers who take up breastfeeding at birth in Stafford district is lower than the national average of 74% for 13 wards, with Penkside, Highfields & Western Downs and Tillington significantly lower.
- 86% of mothers in Church Eaton take up breastfeeding at birth with a slight drop to 69.2% of mothers still breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks.
- The ward of Milford shows the smallest drop in breastfeeding between birth and prevalence at 6-8 weeks with a percentage change of just 7%.
- Breastfeeding prevalence in the Stafford district is marginally above the average for Staffordshire.
- significantly lower across all the wards when compared to England.
- In 7 of the 26 wards over 50% off all mothers breastfeeding at birth do not continue breastfeeding past 6-8 weeks.

- There are 103 PVI childcare providers registered for funded childcare places of which 95% provided a response.
- The current childcare sufficiency shows overall in Stafford there is a 23% vacancy rate approximately for three and four year olds who are entitled to 15 hours of free childcare. For children requiring a Think2 childcare place there is currently a 40% vacancy rate in Stafford.
