

Arts Link Champions -Supporting the Children In Care across the West Midlands

What is a Virtual School?

The Virtual School was introduced in 2014, initially to support Children In Care (of their Local Authority) and has been extended to offer advice and guidance for Previously Looked After Children (PLAC) and most recently providing strategic guidance for Children With Social Workers.

Who are the West Midlands Children in Care Foundation (WMVSCiCFoundation)

The West Midlands region has approximately 11,000 Children In Care, with up to 40% of these residing out of the area to whom they are in care. These are aged from Early Years through to Post 16 and there are also close links with Care Leavers. There are 14 Virtual Schools in the West Midlands region who work in partnership via the WMVSCiC Foundation.

West Midlands Virtual Schools Children In Care Foundation has been established to ensure that:

- All care experienced children & young people are able to access high-quality arts & cultural experiences and activities
- All professional supporting care experienced children are well informed and trained

The WMVS CiC Foundation have three strands to deliver this offer:

- Arts Link
- Active Now Sport
- Creating Chances (Professional Development

The region delivers these programmes locally, in clusters and/or regionally ensuring that all Children In Care are able to access high quality programmes, wherever they may reside.

What is the Arts Link programme?

The Arts Link programme works in partnership with Performing Perfectly, as Arts Coordinators, across the region delivering in six clusters:



- Black Country (Dudley, Sandwell, Walsall, Wolverhampton)
- Coventry, Warwickshire & Solihull
- Herefordshire & Worcestershire
- Staffordshire & Stoke On Trent Telford and Wrekin & Shropshire

The programme is organised by the Arts Co-ordinator for the region working closely with the Arts Ambassador from each Virtual School.

The programme will be enhanced by the development of the Arts Link Champion a leading role model from a range of Arts across the regional and nationally.


