Dear Resident,**Notification of overnight carriageway reconstruction works on the A34 Beecroft Roundabout, Cannock**

As part of the Council's ongoing investment into its roads in Staffordshire, Staffordshire County Council has been awarded funding by the Department of Transport, as part of its Levelling Up Fund. Amey Services Ltd working with Staffordshire County Council, will shortly begin carrying out works on the A34 dual carriageway sections, including the Beecroft roundabout and the approaches. Works will include the removal of the existing carriageway surface and replacing it with a new surface, along with other preparation works known as civil works.

Following on from National Grids overnight works to install a power supply to Cannock Hospital from **Monday 1 April to Friday 5 April 2024**, Staffordshire County Council, we'll begin the first phase of the scheme from **Monday 8 April 2024**. This will include the replacement of pedestrian guard rails, replacing and adjustments of kerbs and setts where necessary, minor footway patching and the re-setting and replacement of carriageway ironworks.

Following on from the civil works, we will begin our carriageway reconstruction works. This will include the removal of the existing carriageway surface and replacing it with a new surface, along with the replacement of new traffic loops and road markings. All works are due to be completed by **Friday 26 April 2024**.

To allow this work to be carried out safely, and to minimise disruption, we'll be working overnight when traffic volumes are lower.

Due to the size and scale of construction machines being used and to ensure the safety of the general public and workforce, sections of the carriageway will at times become impassable and therefore, it will be necessary to close Park Road and Beecroft Road at either side of the junctions of the A34 to through traffic during the overnight works. The road closures will be in place from **19.30pm to 6am**.

Local signed diversion routes will be in place during the closures; along with designated personnel at either end of the closure points to offer assistance and assist with access to residential properties and businesses.

Please plan ahead and allow extra time for your journeys.

Throughout the overnight works, the A34 will be reduced to one lane of traffic in each direction to allow us to work on one side of the dual carriageway. This will minimise disruption to the local community and road users, limit the need for full road closures and diversions, and allow the work to take place safely.

Pedestrian access along the length of the works will be maintained throughout.

Emergency services will be given access through the road closures.

Unfortunately, with any major highway works, some disturbance is unavoidable, and there may be short delays even on the approaches to the closure points. I must ask that you drive carefully and slowly through any sections of live roadworks for both the workforces and your own safety.

The works may at times be noisy, and we apologise in advance for any inconvenience or disturbance caused. We'll do our best to complete the work as quickly and safely as possible. We like to thank you for your patience during this works.

Please note that all dates are subject to change due to operational requirements and weather conditions.
