**Dear Resident,****CX032 - Notification of carriageway reconstruction works on the A5011 Horninglow Road North, Burton Upon Trent**

As part of the Council's ongoing investment into its roads in Staffordshire, Amey Services Ltd working with Staffordshire County Council, will shortly begin carrying out works along A5011 Horninglow Road North, (from north of the junction of Farm Road) to Tutbury Road (up to number 11). Works to include the junctions of Field Lane (up to number 24) and Calais Road (up to the junction of Charnwood Road). Works will include the removal of the existing carriageway surface and replacing it with a new surface (and associated preparatory works known as 'civil works'), alongside drainage repair, clearance and minor footway works. This location was highlighted by the local County Councillor for Horninglow and Stretton, Bernard Peters and forms part of the wider highway investment works to help increase the lifespan of the roads in Staffordshire.

From **Monday 13 January 2025**, we'll begin the first phase of the scheme. This will include the replacement and adjustment of kerbs, tactile crossing upgrade, minor footway patching, repairs to the drainage system and cleaning and jetting the highway gullies and manholes.

These initial works will be carried out under temporary traffic signals during the daytime between the hours of **07.30am** and **16.00pm**. Temporary traffic signals may need to remain in place over night to guard open excavations and to allow for material curing times.

The civil works are due to be completed on **Friday 31 January 2025**.

Following on from the civil works, we will begin our carriageway reconstruction works, this will include the re-setting and replacement of carriageway ironworks, the removal of the existing carriageway surface and replacing it with a new surface, along with the replacement of new road markings. Due to the size and scale of construction machines being used and to ensure the safety of the general public and workforce, this phase of works will be carried out under **full road closures**. These works will begin at **07.30am** on **Monday 3 February** and are due to be completed by **Friday 14 February 2025**. The road closure positions will vary dependent on the section where we are working. You should expect each section where we are working to be closed 24 hours a day during resurfacing and curing of the newly laid road surfaces. During these works there will also be times when on street parking will be restricted and any residents affected will be notified in advance.



A local signed diversion route will be in place during the closure; along with designated personnel at either end of the closure points to offer assistance with residential properties and business access. **Access to properties and business will be maintained when safe to do so during the closures.** Please plan ahead and allow extra time for your journeys.

A primary road diversion route will be in place for through traffic during the closures.

**Emergency services will be given access through the road closures when safe to do so.**

Pedestrian access along the length of the works will be maintained throughout.

Regrettably, bus stops along the scheme of works will be suspended during the road closures. If you require any further information about this service, please speak to your bus operator.

Unfortunately, with any major highway works, some disturbance is unavoidable, and there may be short delays even on the approaches to the closure points. We must ask that you drive carefully and slowly through any sections of live roadworks for both the workforces and your own safety.

During the road closure period, waste and recycling collections will remain the same, on their normal collection days.

Please note that all dates are subject to change due to operational requirements and weather conditions. Weekend working may be used where necessary.

The works may at times be noisy, and we apologise in advance for any inconvenience or disturbance caused. We'll do our best to complete the work as quickly and safely as possible. We like to thank you for your patience during this works.
